




Sponsor websites and listservs



Apply for Funding - Sponsored Research with a deadline

Step 1

- **Identify** a funding opportunity; review sponsor and program eligibility requirements and deadlines
- Notify approvers (in IPO or RSO) of intention to apply

Step 2

• **Develop** research proposal and budget, complete required forms (CCVs, support letters, certificates, research security attestations, etc.)

Step 3

- **Submit** MRA* as early as possible ideally 1 week prior to sponsor deadline; include budget, scope of work, other required forms/documents
- **Submit** final application package to sponsor (PI/Division directly or IPO/RSO approvers depending on sponsor/Program)

*MRA: My Research Applications & Agreements



Apply for Funding - Sponsored research with no deadline

Develop scope of work and budget

Draft description of the proposed project and budget.

Engage Develop Negotiate

Engage with partner

Identify key areas of expertise and identify funder to collaborate on common research objectives.

Negotiate agreement

Consult with IPO/RSO to initiate negotiations and secure institutional sign off.

Key Points

- 1. The U of T Research Funding Ecosystem includes people, processes, policies and resources that support researchers in securing and managing research funding.
- Consult with the responsible central research office Innovations and Partnerships Office (IPO) or Research Services Office (RSO) - prior to submission of research funding to ensure applications and agreements are submitted in full and on time.
- MRA submission is required for all research funding (i.e., to obtain Chair or Dean approval)
- 4. Funding opportunities can be found in a variety of ways.
