






What Did We Hear From Our End-users?



- Users expressed frustration with FReD's inefficient navigation flow and difficult-to-read text
- Users expressed a strong desire to streamline visual elements and navigation flows, based on the following broad principles:
 - Easy to read content
 - Expandable/collapsible menus
 - Help menus and tool tips

What Did We Hear From Our End-users?



- Many users were frustrated by the current, e-mail-based process by which funding documents are distributed.
- Users wanted to see important documents such as award letters and funding agreements attached to the FReD

Overview

The Division of the Vice President, Research & Innovation (VPRI) in partnership with the Office of the Chief Information Officer (CIO) has embarked on an initiative to upgrade and modernize My Research On Line (MROL) and the Funded Research Digest (FReD) into a new service called My Research Funds (MRF). MRF will serve as an online interface to the University of Toronto's (U of T's) Research Information System (RIS) and Financial Information System (FIS), providing principal investigators (PIs), project managers, divisional administrators, and VPRI administrators with role-based access to key research funding information, including terms and conditions for awarded applications, financial account details, and funding history.

MRF will replace MROL and FReD and transform these systems into a modern research funding administration service that supports the University's complex research enterprise. The upgrade will allow users to access the same information they are familiar with in a streamlined interface and new functionalities.

This initiative is part of U of T's renewal of its SAP systems under the <u>U of T Enterprise Modernization Program</u>.
