



Preparing your application – General considerations

Participants and Partners

Participants = Individuals

- Project Director
- Co-applicants
- Collaborators

Partners = Organizations

- Host Institution
- Partner Organizations
- Other Contributors

How can I be involved in the partnership?

SSHRC established categories and eligibility related to use of funds

People on research team

- Project Director: must be affiliated with host institution
- Co-applicant: eligible if from Canadian Postsecondary institutions; not-for-profit organizations; philanthropic foundations; think tanks; or municipal, territorial or provincial governments; and international post-secondary institutions
- Collaborator: any individual who makes a significant contribution to the project is eligible, including those not eligible as co-applicants (e.g. participants from private forprofit sector, federal government, independent researchers)

Organizations in partnership

- Host Institution: a post-secondary institution or not-for-profit organization with institutional eligibility with SSHRC
- Partner organization: a Canadian or international organization contributing to the partnership

Can we deviate from SSHRC participant categories?

- Participants must be entered into the application form as project director, co-applicants and collaborators based on their affiliation and involvement in the partnership. Eligibility to use funds is based on these categories. It is important to negotiate and manage expectations from the start.
- Teams may propose their own governance structure and use categories they
 wish within the narrative sections of the application and, if awarded, in the
 daily operations of the project.
- Examples of categories we see in narrative portions of applications: project directors, co-directors, co-leads, co-applicants, collaborators, partner organizations, project coordinators, Elders, students, post-doctoral fellows, community participants, consultants

Program Selection

Selecting: Insight and/or Connection

- Focus of <u>Insight</u> is research activities
- Focus of <u>Connection</u> is knowledge mobilization

Program Selection

Selecting: Talent

- PG Talent proposals should focus primarily on the research training of registered post-secondary students and postdoctoral researchers in the SSH.
- Proposals should meet objectives of the <u>Talent Program</u> and the <u>Guidelines for Partnered Research Training Initiatives</u>.
- Majority of funds should be dedicated to research training activities for students and postdoctoral researchers in the SSH (approx. 75%).

Indigenous Research

- SSHRC is committed to supporting and promoting research by and with Indigenous Peoples: <u>Indigenous</u> <u>Research Statement of Principles</u>
- Definition of <u>Indigenous Research</u>
- SSHRC has developed <u>Guidelines for the Merit</u> Review of Indigenous Research

Research-Creation

- Definition of <u>research-creation</u>
- Approach that combines creative and academic research practices
- Include attachment with website link
- You can list up to three samples of work
- Guidelines for Research-Creation Support Materials





 - Co-applicants and collaborators must have SSHRC online portfolio to accept invitation
- Description of Team
- ✓ Invited Partner Organizations
 - Online invitation
 - ✓ Letter of Support


PARTNERSHIP MODULES



✓ List of Potential Partners/Contributors

- Contributions Plan
 - ✓ Detail your plans to secure cash and/or in-kind contributions
 - ✓ At Stage 2, applicants must demonstrate that they will secure, over and above the budge requested from SSHRC, a minimum of 35 percent in additional resources from sources other than SSHRC during the life of the grant

BUDGET MODULES



- ✓ Funds SSHRC (Full Project Estimates)
 - ✓ Amount requested for Stage 1 up to \$20,000 to prepare second stage application
 - ✓ Enter estimates for the full project (4-7 years)
- ✓ Funds Other (Partner Contributions)
 - Entered by the Project Director at Stage 1
- ✓ Budget Justification (Stage 1 Funds Only)
 - ✓ No justification of full project estimates

Evaluation criteria

Challenge – Aim and importance of the Endeavour (40%)

Feasibility – The plan to achieve excellence (30%)

Capability – The expertise to succeed (30%)



Tips and Best Practices

- Ensure proposal addresses all the evaluation criteria.
- Involve team/partners in preparing the application.
- Walk participants and partners through the invitation process.
- Highlight team member publications in List of References (bold font)

Tips and Best Practices (continued)

- Consider the formatting and ease of reading for the reviewers.
- Consider your audience (multidisciplinary).
- Proofread and review PDF.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Can I request research tools for my project?
 - > Tools are vehicles that facilitate research and related activities.
 - > Between \$7K and \$500K can be requested for tools.
 - ➤ Infrastructure funding available from CFI's John R. Evan's Leaders Fund.

FAQ (continued)

Q: Is the time that a participant plans to dedicate to the project an eligible in-kind contribution?

A: Yes, if participant is from public, private or not-for-profit organization. The time that *faculty* participants devote to the project *cannot* be counted but the cost of hiring a sessional to take over a course for a participant on the grant may be counted as a cash contribution.

Q: Can a participant receive a salary from the grant?

A: The project director, co-applicants and collaborators cannot receive a salary from the grant.

FAQ (continued)

Q: Can SSHRC funds be requested for the costs of a project coordinator and/or manager?

A: Yes, but this person can't be a participant on the grant, can't be paid for administrative services normally provided by the university, and can't be paid to conduct research activities.
