SSHRC Partnership Programs

“Partner” in SSHRC programs means:

- An organization (not an individual) that participates actively and contributes in a meaningful way to the success of the endeavour.
- A Canadian or foreign postsecondary institution (and can be, for example, a specific centre or institute within a university), government department (federal, provincial, territorial, municipal), for-profit or not-for-profit organization, or foundations.
- The partner is expected to provide cash and/or in-kind contribution.

SSHRC Partnership Programs

Three Funding Opportunities for new and existing partnerships:

1. Partnership Engage Grants

Provide short-term and timely support for partnered research activities that will inform decision-making at a single partner organization from the public, private or not-for-profit sector.

2. Partnership Development Grants

“Fostering” partnerships to explore a new approach or to test a partnership approach to research & related activities that could lead to best practices or models. Partners bring cash and/or in-kind resources.

3. Partnership Grants

Formal partnerships engaging in research and/or knowledge mobilization through mutual co-operation, sharing of intellectual leadership, and resources in the form of cash and/or in-kind contribution.

SSHRC Partnership Programs

| Funding opportunity | Adjudication | Partnership | Duration | Value | Matching contribution |
|---------------------|---|--|-----------|-----------------|-----------------------|
| PEG | One stage (quarterly deadlines) – 8-9 weeks | Single partner, private or public sector, not academic – formal partnership; letter of engagement but no formal agreement required | 1 year | \$7k - \$25k | No minimum |
| PDG | One stage (Nov) – 4-5 months | Formal partnership exists or will be developed; evidence of partnership plus letters of engagement | 1-3 years | \$75k - \$200k | No minimum |
| PG | Stage 1 - Feb 15; Stage 2 (by invitation) Nov 1 | Institutional application. Formal partnership, new or existing; at Stage 1 host institution letter plus letters of engagement | 4-7 years | \$500k - \$2.5m | 35% |

SSHRC Partnership Programs

Insight and Connection - and Talent

- PEG – proposals must meet the objectives of SSHRC's Insight and Connection programs
- PDG – Insight and/or Connection (either order)
- PG – Insight and/or Connection (either order)
or SSHRC's Talent program

SSHRC Partnership Programs

Partnership Engage Grant:

- 1 year. Four competitions/year - September, December, March and June
- \$7,000 to \$25,000
- Multi-disciplinary adjudication committees (no external reviews)
- Partner must be non-academic
- Project must address immediate challenge/opportunity of partner
- Contribution required from partner (no minimum amount)
- Salary research allowance for Canadian non-profit organization participant(s) only, up to 50% per year to backfill a position
- Joint initiative: successful awards pre-approved for Mitacs Accelerate internships (up to \$15k each, half to come from partner)

SSHRC Partnership Programs

Partnership Development Grant:

- 1 to 3 years
- \$75,000 to \$200,000
- Multi-disciplinary adjudication committees (no external reviews)
- Contribution required from partners (no minimum amount)
- Salary research allowance for Canadian non-profit organization participant(s) only, up to 50% per year
- Evidence of Formal Partnership required
- Applicants to PDG need not have a plan to apply for PG at a later date
- Joint initiatives: Mitacs, Societal Implications of Genomics, Canada Mortgage & Housing

SSHRC Partnership Programs

Partnership Grant:

- 4 to 7 years
- Typically \$500,000 to \$2.5 million
- Min. 35% match to SSHRC request, from cash and in-kind resources
- Two-step process: Stage 1, for to \$20k to prepare Stage 2 full proposal
- Stage 2 proposal – external expert panel, evaluation committee and interview
- Salary research allowance for Canadian non-profit organization participant(s) only, up to 50% per year
- Evidence of Formal Partnership required by Stage 2
- Joint initiative: CFI, Mitacs

SSHRC Partnership Programs

Evaluation Criteria: Must get a “pass” in each section

| Criteria | Partnership Engage Grants | Partnership Development Grants | Partnership Grants |
|-------------|---------------------------|--------------------------------|--------------------|
| Challenge | 60% | 50% | 40% |
| Feasibility | 20% | 20% | 30% |
| Capability | 20% | 30% | 30% |

SSHRC Partnership Programs

Eligibility to Apply

- UofT approval + SSHRC approval
- For all programs - approved MRA is due by the internal deadline
- Access to MRA determined by eligibility to hold an award at UofT (Provost's guidelines)
- SSHRC application prepared online, submitted by applicant to RSO
- After RSO review and institutional approval, RSO forwards app to SSHRC
- Postdocs and PhD students can apply directly to SSHRC for PDG and PG
 - Will need formal affiliation to hold grant
