

2022 Dorothy Killam Research Fellowship – Process for Referees

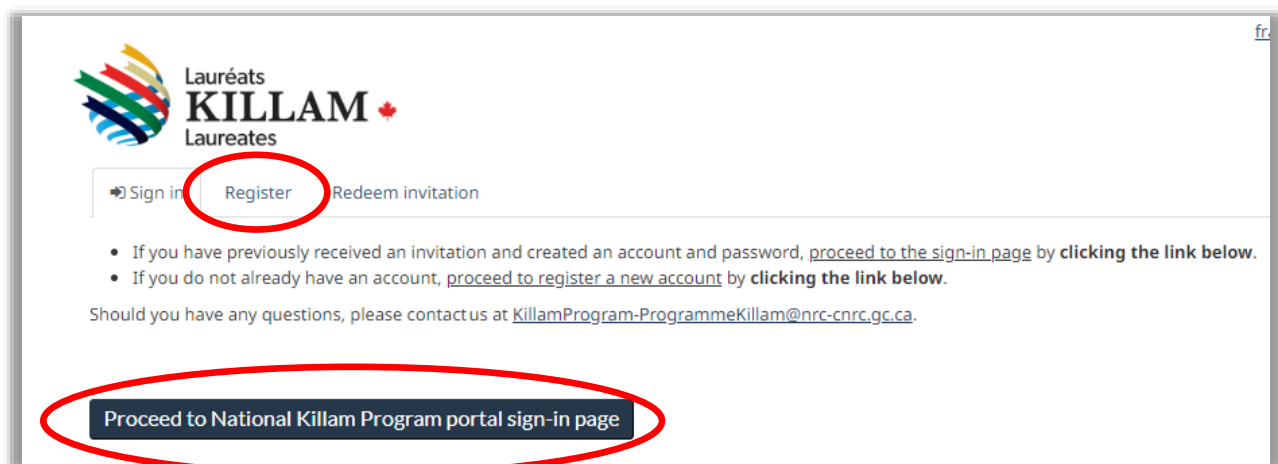
Applicants for the Dorothy Killam Research Fellowship require two reference letters. When an applicant includes the name and contact details (eg, email address) of a referee in their application, then the referee would receive three emails from the Killam program staff.

- The first email (text included here as Appendix 1) is just to notify the referee of their inclusion in the application.
- The second email (text included here as Appendix 2) is to invite the referee to create an account in the [Killam application portal](#).
- The third email (text included here as Appendix 3) includes information about the letter that is required and what is asked of the referee (in correspondence with Killam staff, it was said that there is a bit of a delay between the first and third emails, so if a referee has not yet received the second email, then they can consult Appendix 3 here for information on what is expected of their reference letter, or the screenshot on page 7, which also includes this information).

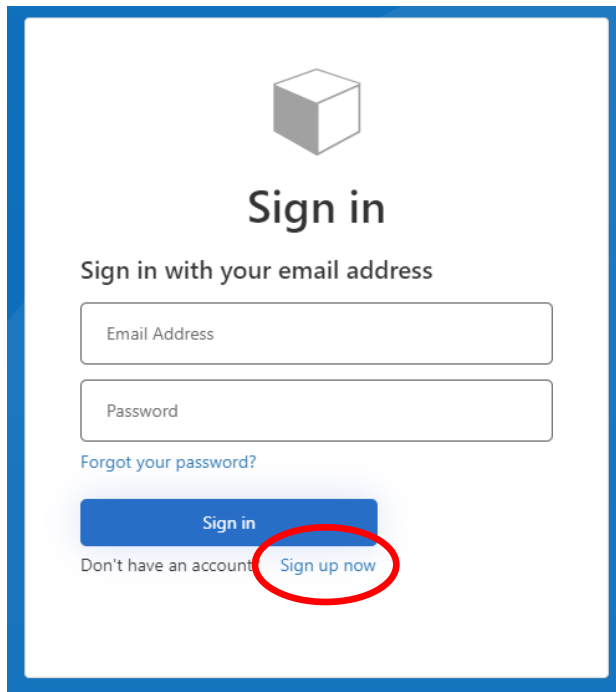
Once a referee has completed their reference letter, then that referee is required to upload the letter into the Killam site. The following screenshots illustrate how this can be done. For any technical assistance for questions that this document does not answer, then my apologies, but the Killam staff would have to be directly contacted at NRC.KillamProgram-ProgrammeKillam.CNRC@nrc-cnrc.gc.ca.

Instructions for a referee who has been asked to write a reference letter for a Killam Fellowship applicant:

1. **Go to the Killam application portal and register for an account** (you would register for an account using the same email address that the Fellowship applicant would have identified for you in their Killam application, and where you had received the automatically-generated email from the Killam portal (email #1 or #2):

 - a. Click on the “Register” option
 - b. Then click on the “Proceed to National Killam Program portal sign-in page” button

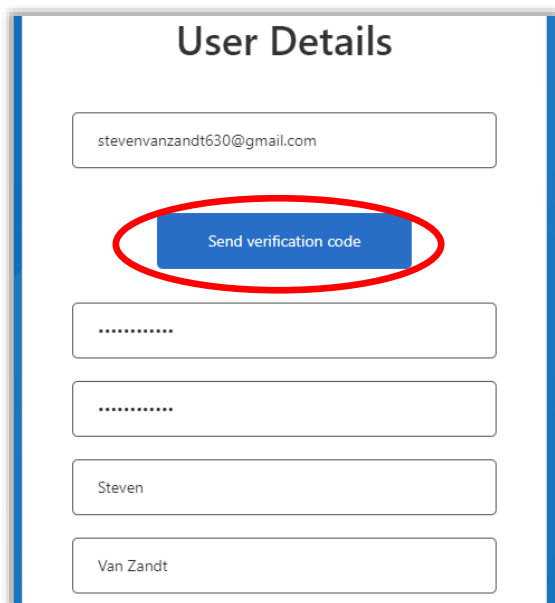


- c. Click the “Sign up now” option

- e. The verification code would have been sent to your email address, so check your email inbox, and look for the email with the verification code. Then, copy the code, go back to the Killam “User Details” screen, paste the code into the “Verification code” field, and press the “Verify code” button. If the verification works, then you can press the “Create” button.

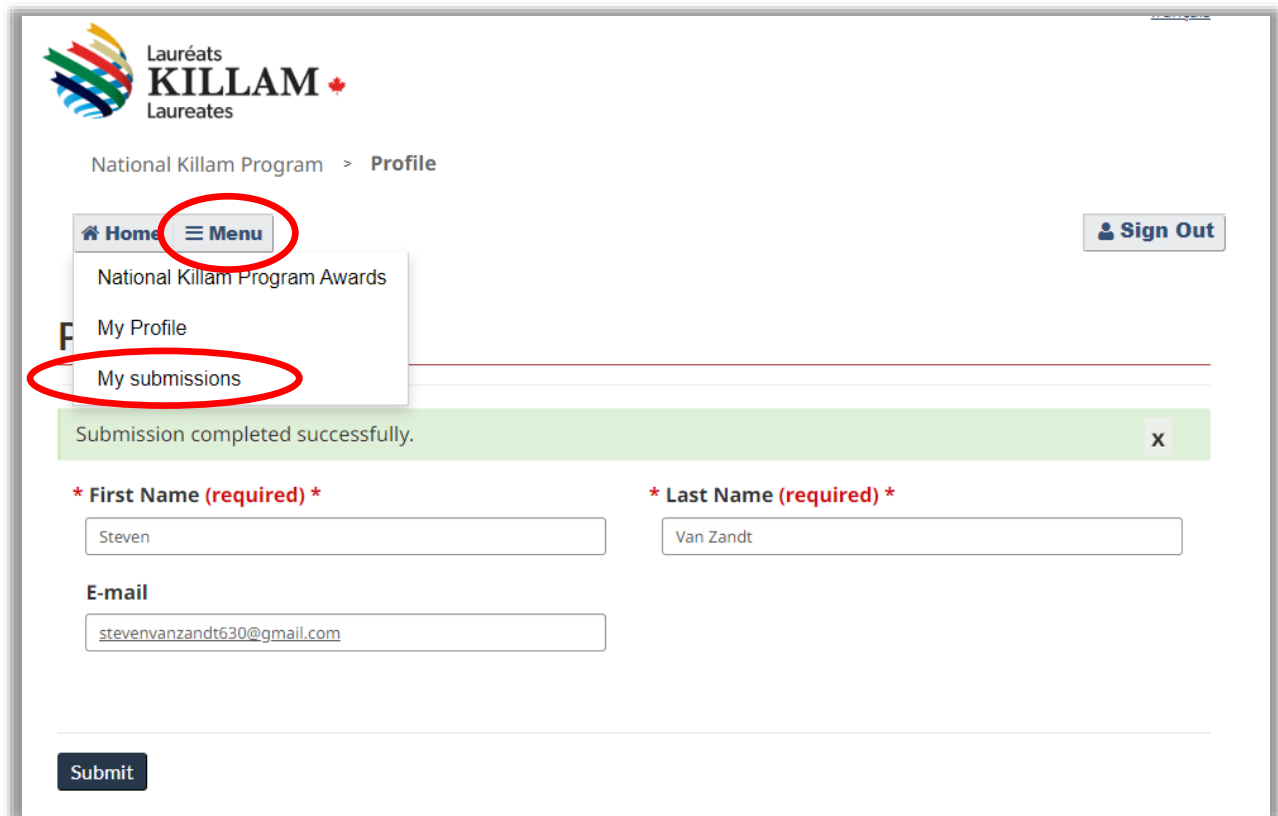

- f. You will then be taken to the “Terms and Conditions” page of the Killam portal (as if you are the applicant, which is not the case, but nonetheless). Just click on the “I agree to these terms and conditions” box and press the “Continue” button at the bottom of the page.
- g. You will then be taken to a “Profile” page, so just review the information to ensure it is correct, and then press “Submit”.

- h. Now press on the “Menu” option near the top of the “Profile” screen and select “My submissions”. Once on the “My submissions” page of your Killam account, you will be able to complete your role as Referee for the Fellowship applicant.

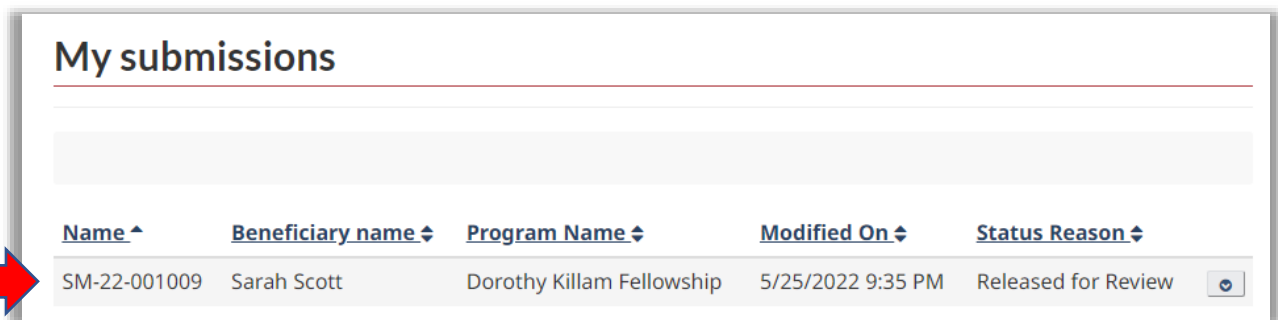

- a. When you get to the “My submissions” page of your Killam account, you should be able to see the application from the Applicant who requested your reference letter.

- d. You will then be brought to the “Identification of applicant” page. You can review the applicant’s information if need be, but referees are not required to do anything on this page, so just hit “Next” at the bottom of the page.
- e. You will next be brought to the “Letter of support” page where a referee can upload their letter for the applicant (this page also has details on what referees are asked to include in the letter, so see text in the screenshot below (on the next page) for your reference). To upload a letter:
 - click on “Add a letter of support” button
 - enter a “Description” (eg, “Letter of support for [Applicant name]”
 - press “Choose file” and attach your letter (note: a word document uploads successfully, but when testing, a PDF upload produced an error for some reason)
 - Press “submit”
 - Back on the “Letter of support” main page, press the “Validate and save” button.
 - If all is well, press the “Next” button at the bottom of the page (see screenshot of this section of the application on the next page)

- If translated from another language, the original letter must also be submitted

You will need an understanding of the applicant's work, and be willing to speak to the exceptional quality of the candidate's research achievements, nationally and internationally where applicable, and the candidate's outstanding commitment, creativity and efforts to share research knowledge beyond the academic community.

For the Killam Prize

Please ensure your letter contains a review of the applicant which references the following:

- exceptional quality of the candidate's research achievements
- evidence of the candidate's outstanding commitment, creativity and efforts to share research knowledge beyond the academic community
- enduring contribution of the candidate's ideas and research results to Canadian society, including the nation's intellectual and/or cultural life
- scope of the candidate's research contributions, taking into account the norms of the field of study
- international stature of the candidate, where appropriate

For the Dorothy Killam Fellowship

A Dorothy Killam Fellow is a leading researcher whose superior, ground-breaking, best-in-class research stands to have significant impact on a national or global scale. A Fellow is someone who also reflects one or more of the Killam attributes:

- Inclusive collaborator - whose work exemplifies inclusion and understanding of people, cultures and needs with participation among all economic, social and cultural backgrounds
- Barrier breaker - whose original, transformational, future-focused generation of knowledge and technology stands to change the way we live
- Research leader - who activates thoughtful cooperation among scholars, disciplines and institutions to create a multiplier effect within the research ecosystem

The Dorothy Killam Fellowship is meant to support scholars who:

- demonstrate commitment to building Canada's future and alignment with Killam attributes

- f. You will then be brought to the “Research category” page, but referees are not required to do anything on this page, so just hit “Next”.
- g. Finally, you will be brought to the “Validation and submit” page. Here you:
 - Click “Accept” under the “Letter of Acceptance” heading (as this confirms you are willing to submit a reference letter for the Fellowship applicant)
 - Click on “Submit form”
 - A “Submit” box will pop up, confirming that you understand that once you press “submit”, you won’t be able to modify your submission of the letter. If you agree, press “Ok”.

After the above has been completed, the applicant will receive an automatically-generated email that confirms that you, as the Referee, have accepted their request for a letter of reference.

***Information for Applicants:

After a referee has completed the above steps, then you will receive that automatically generated email (as above), and in your application in your own Killam portal account, go to the “Identification of experts providing letters of support” section of your application, and you should see that the “Status” of that referee has changed to “Expert submitted letter”.

The text below is from the third email message that referees would receive (this is not an automatically generated message, so there could be a delay of a few days between a referee receiving the first email (above in Appendix 1) and their receipt of this second email).

An applicant must be an established scholar who has performed outstanding research and who has published the results of this research over a period of several years.
